# Department of Justice and Community Safety Traditional Owner Settlement Act 2010 Recognition and Settlement Agreement reached with the TAUNGURUNG

The State of Victoria and the **Taungurung Land and Waters Council Aboriginal Corporation** (ICN 4191) (the Corporation) have entered into a Recognition and Settlement Agreement (the Agreement) under the *Traditional Owner Settlement Act 2010* (Vic) (the TOS Act). The Corporation is appointed by the Taungurung Traditional Owner group as the Traditional Owner group entity. The Agreement between the State of Victoria and the Corporation **commenced on 11 August 2020** and commits the parties to an ongoing partnership, and includes obligations and benefits for both parties.

The Agreement under the TOS Act recognises the Taungurung as the Traditional Owner group in the Agreement area (see map below), and their rights to access and use the land and its natural resources in accordance with the terms of the Agreement. It also provides a regime for the Corporation to comment on, negotiate about, or consent to certain activities on public land in the Agreement area.



The Agreement provides for the transfer of up to five sites in fee simple to the Corporation and the granting to the Corporation of 'Aboriginal Title' of nine parks within the Agreement area, to be jointly managed with the state. It also includes a funding agreement for the Corporation to manage its obligations, undertake economic development activities, and improve social and cultural outcomes for the Taungurung people.







Murrindindi Shire Council is inviting community members to have their say and help Council develop a new Community Engagement Policy, in accordance with the new Local Government Act.

The purpose of a Community Engagement Policy is to formalise Council's commitment to engaging with communities across Murrindindi Shire through the use of appropriate, effective and inclusive engagement practices.

Council's Director Community Engagement Shivaun Brown said Council is committed to delivering best practice community consultation.

'We're updating our Policy and practices to support the best possible engagement with community members. We understand the importance of designing community engagement methods that work for our community. If we get the methods right, it will make it much easier for you to let us know what you think about a plan, initiative or project, when we ask you to have your say.

'So to get a better understanding of how we can best engage with you we're inviting you to take part in the 'Your Opinion Matters' survey or to get involved in one of our 90-minute, online focus group discussions', said Ms Brown.

'The survey should only take you around 15 minutes to complete. It will ask you whether you feel like Council provides enough opportunities for you to share your thoughts and feedback on projects that impact you. It will also look at what we can do to improve how we run community consultation sessions and what we might be able to do to encourage more of you to get involved.

'The survey is open until 7 January 2021 and you can either complete it online at murrindindi.vic.gov.au/youropinionmatters or drop into our Library and Customer Service Centre in Yea, Kinglake or Alexandra and fill out a paper survey in person.

'If you think a focus group discussion is more your style, then I'd encourage you to come along to an online session at 10.30 am on either Tuesday 15 December or Friday 18 December. If the morning doesn't suit, we're also holding a session at 7.00 pm on Thursday 17 December. Registrations are essential for each focus group session, so head online and register your details at murrindindi.vic.gov.au/youropinionmatters.

'The more ideas and feedback we hear from you now, the better our approach will be to engaging with you in future. We'll share the new draft policy with you early next year and give you another opportunity to let us know if you think our approach is heading in the right direction', Ms Brown added.

Members of Men's Sheds come from all walks of life - the bond that unites them is that they are men with time on their hands and would like something meaningful to do with that time.


