



# LANDCARE UPDATE



## - by Ken Mival

This update is to inform Flowerdale community of the activities being undertaken by Flowerdale Landcare Group and the opportunities for involvement. Membership costs only \$20 per joint year and for that you get the opportunity to use equipment for weed control and take part in a number of other conservation activities.

Many volunteers gathered on Sunday 21 February to do our share for **Clean-up Australia** (although 2 weeks ahead of THE day - getting a mention on the front page of the Yea Chronicle). We cleared Coonan's Reserve of a large amount of debris left by groups of fly campers and also dumped material (including various broken-down tents and a bag full of Bras!). We then moved on to the Pioneer Bridge area north of Long Gully where lazy locals think it is a free dumping ground - including old artificial Christmas trees, pushchairs, carpeting and parts of an old hot water tank. Some diligent folks also walked along the tracks north and south of Hazeldene picking up roadside rubbish. We filled a trailer and Landcruiser with the waste. Well done to Steve and the crew.

European Wasp control. Steve has been doing an excellent job tracking down and eliminating over 70 wasp nests in the local community. For a small donation for the chemicals used, this can be provided to local residents if you have a wasp problem.

In our recent March committee meeting, a number of decisions were taken for the year ahead. The following are dates to put in your diaries:

April - The KPC Fox Control Committee will be starting the next round of camera monitoring for wildlife and foxes. This will be followed by the next round of Fox baiting to take place over about 3 to 4 weeks in May/June. We have had significant success in reducing fox numbers with hundreds of baits taken over the last 4 years at a steadily declining rates and want to continue on that success.

We have gone from a few Long-nosed Bandicoot sightings up to over 60 last year as reported in our July update. So we are winning the war - but need to keep it going for another couple of years at least. If you want to be involved in the next round - you will need to contact Landcare immediately as you cannot bait unless you have undertaken monitoring first and notified neighbours. The cameras are a limited number on

loan from DELWP, so first in or miss out.





## <u>Minestrone Soup</u>

## Ingredients:

- 3 Bacon rasher roughly chopped
- 2 Carrots peeled and chopped
- 2 celery sticks chopped
- 1 Onion finely chopped
- 1 potato peeled and chopped
- 2 garlic cloves chopped
- 4 cups of beef stock
- 400g can chopped tomatoes
- 400g can of red kidney beans
- 1 cup of shell pasta
- 1/3 fresh parsley

Parmesan

## Method:

- 1. Place bacon, onion, celery, carrots and potato in a large saucepan and stir until combined.

  Cook over high heat, uncovered stirring often for 5 mins.
- 2. Add the garlic, beef stock, tomatoes and red kidney beans to the pan, cover and bring to the boil. Reduce heat to medium—low. Simmer, covered, stirring occasionally for 30 mins or until vegetables are tender.
- 3. Increase to high heat and add pasta and cook uncovered stirring occasionally, until pasta is cooked through.
- 4. Sprinkle with parsley and parmesan. Serve with crusty bread.

Montessori practice follows the guidelines of Doctor Maria Montessori's life work. She advocated for the child to be accepted as he/she presents, supported to develop to full her/his potential and to learn through respect and hands-on experiences.



The Learning Space is set with activities that invite the child to engage in purposeful activity and adaptation to the real world. Between Birth and age 3, the child works to develop attachment to others, language skills and co-ordination of movement. Family members are the first "teachers" supporting the child in these early years. Branching out to a wider community and strengthening these capacities is the work of the 3 to 6 year old child.

Playgroup offers an opportunity to support each other and learn from each other. As we accept each child, recognize and value their differences we do the same for the adults. Each of us has much to offer and we will all grow through the shared experience.

The playroom perhaps looks and feels different to other play spaces. The Montessori approach encourages us to offer the children an inviting place where activity can support the child in her/ his self construction. With that in mind, the activities have a sense of order and include cleaning up after oneself and allowing others their opportunity to be active with the task.

This term has offered outdoor play with ride-ons and the sandbox plus the beauty of the garden. "Window painting" was also on hand. Indoors, play dough (the recipe is on the Cream of Tartar box) is always a firm favorite. "Art " supplies with paint, crayons, pencils and chalk were there to explore and to begin the task of self expression through materials. Rattles, push cars, soft toys, bells and blocks allow the young child to explore movement and sound. Bubble beating, sand sifting and tongs invited activity and brought a practical opportunity for concentration to develop. Mat time included conversation, rhymes, songs and

stories. These activities afforded a relaxed sharing time to encourage a feeling of belonging. And the sharing of food, an old social activity, rounded off the session.

With the two year FRRR grant, the Flowerdale Community House is able to offer a facilitated program for 2021 and 2022. Hopefully, we can learn together and the program will fulfil your expectations. The activities on offer will change and expand as we progress. If there are additions you would like to see please share your thoughts and we can work to make things happen. The changing weather will will play a part in the changes as will the children's need for different which will help develop the child's independence challenges. Keep coming along and together we can support the young ones to belong and become their strongest self.
