

It's a fun, simple, family-friendly and safe activity observing nature, which is proven to provide benefits to mental health and wellbeing.



Government's Housing Statement Explained

If the year 2020, capstone by Covid, brought that decade to a less than stunning end, then the government's housing statement in 2023 heralds the next – consider the intervening few years a brief interlude: the next decade will be defined by how our state responds to housing demand.

In May the Federal government announced that it was planning to set the 23-24 permanent Migration Program at 190,000 places. This is part of the reason why the national housing target is 240,000 new homes each year for the next five years. As far forward as 2051, Melbourne is expected to house 10.3 million people. And while news outlets early in the year proclaimed that Melbourne (because of shifting urban boundaries) had exceeded Sydney on a technicality, the reality is, Melbourne will be categorically more populous than Sydney in a short time.

In light of this, it is no surprise that the last thing Daniel Andrews did was announce housing reform.

Whether the Housing Statement was a political stunt pulled by the outgoing premier is yet to be determined, but beware: simple announcements are never simple in practice or legislation. To keep it simple for you, we're going to break down just a few of the main announcements that

No planning permits for tiny houses

are on the minds of regional Victorians.

The fine print here is "for properties without an overlay". Tiny houses and other semipermanent dwellings will still be subject to local laws. Remember, the purpose of overlays is to control how much dwellings are built on bushfire prone land, and also to place constraints on septic systems to reduce environmental impact.

No planning permits for new dwellings on lots bigger than 300 sqm

Again, this doesn't apply to properties with an overlay on them. The most common overlay in Victoria is the Bushfire Management Overlay, which covers a huge percentage of the state's land. The purpose of this overlay is to ensure that new homes and renovations exceeding 25 per cent of existing footprint are built appropriate to the conditions for defending against bushfire. We expect that planning permits will continue to be a feature of building in regional.

Rent increases

The government claims that they will limit rent increases between successive fixed-term rental agreements. The period of notice owners must give to increase rent or to issue a Notice to Vacate will be extended from 60 to 90 days.

Conclusion

We may see less power in the hands of local councillors and more at state government level, designed to not only shift the power balance but speed up the long convoluted planning process.

While greater attention on housing is generally a good thing, we hope that, when this pithy announcements come to legislation, the legislation will be well-throttled in parliament to ensure that Victorians don't get the raw end of the stick.


